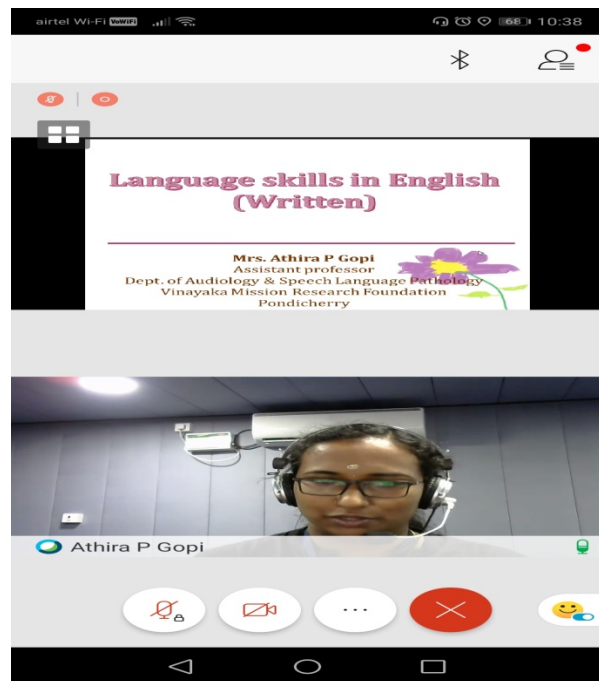
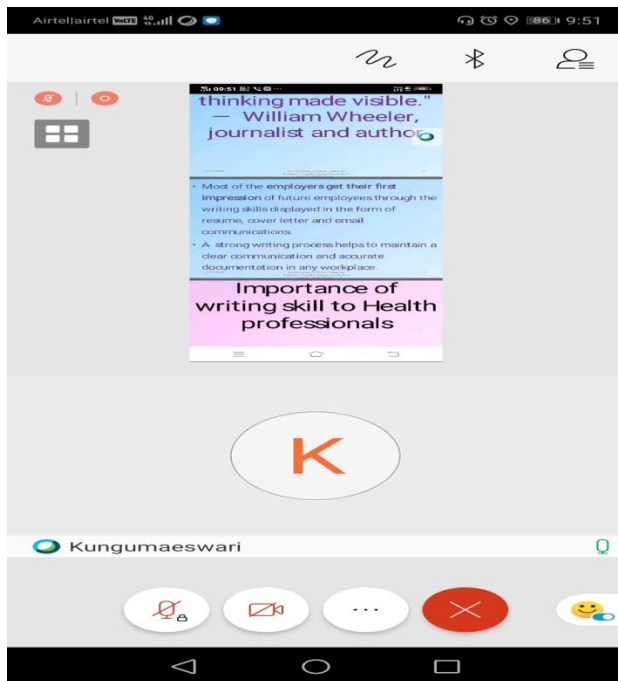
REPORT ON STUDENT INDUCTION PROGRAMME – 22.12.2020
